A Service that is always on the front line when it comes to meeting vulnerable people.

SASMAD/PHC currently has about 500 volunteers who do home visits with the sick, either directly in their homes, in seniors' residences or in CHSLD's in the diocesan district of Montreal. There are now five separate regions: Montreal West, Montreal Centre, Montreal East, Laval-Repentigny and the English-language sector dispersed throughout these regions. Each region is administered by a coordinator under the direction of André Dupré, who succeeded Sister Madeleine Saint-Michel as Director upon her retirement. A few years ago, the SASMAD/PHC offices moved from their original location at Saint Jude's parish to new quarters in the same neighbourhood of Ahuntsic, in the presbytery of Saint Isaac-Jogues church on Chabanel Street east.
